


Journal Definition: A periodical that is published by a special group, a learned society, or certain profession. Typically published monthly and often includes volumes and or issues

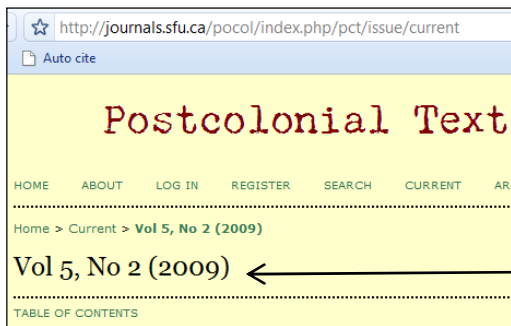

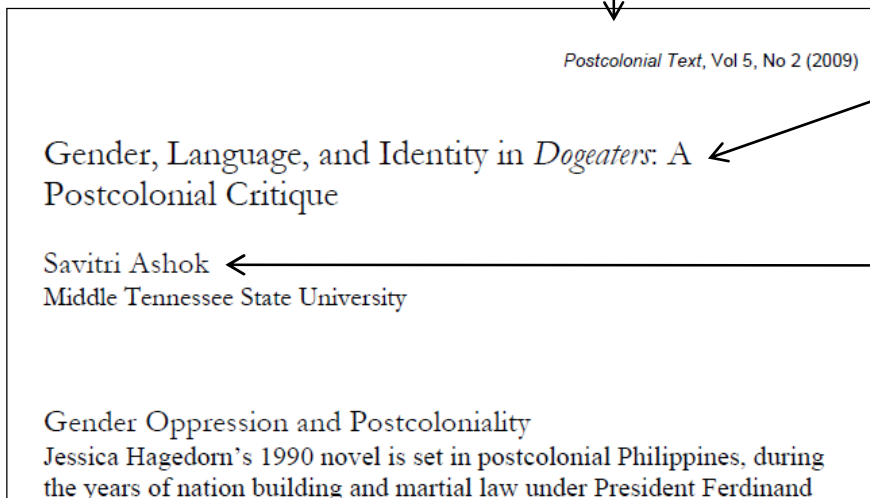
